OBJECTIVES OF THE COURSE: The objective of this course is to prepare you for a course in finite mathematics, statistics, trigonometry, calculus for business and social sciences, other further study in mathematics, or to equip you for employment.

The course covers chapters 7 through 14 of the text.

STUDENT MATERIALS AND HELP AVAILABLE:

Required text: *Elementary and Intermediate Algebra* by Bittinger, Ellenbogen, and Johnson

The Math Learning Center, located in HH 215 has instructors and student tutors on duty to help you, M-F 8:00 am to 9:45 pm, and Sa 9:00 am to 12:45 pm The Math Learning Center has also a computer program to supplement your text. Free tutoring is also available.

CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION: We will be covering 1 to 2 sections per class. Each class meeting will begin with a **short** period of questions-and-answers. Your homework assignment consists of all every other odd problems from each section. Homework will be collected on the test days. It should be stapled, in order, and include the section number of each assignment. Both the problem and the solution should be shown on the paper. Answers only will not be accepted.

EXAMINATIONS: There will be 6 exams, frequent quizzes, and a comprehensive final exam on **Wednesday, Dec. 12th, 12:00 to 2:00 p.m.** During exams/quizzes no cheating (copying from or giving answers to other students, unauthorized use of books, notes, etc.)! Tests/quizzes during which cheating occurs are worth zero points, and further action may be taken accordingly to the Policy on Academic Dishonesty.

MAKE UP EXAMS AND GRADE IMPROVEMENT. There are no make-up tests or quizzes for any reason. Late homework will be worth 1/2 points. I'll drop the lowest score on your chapter tests before determining your final grade from the course. A missed test will be counted as the test that will be dropped. No extra credit will be allowed.
