IV. Presentation from Outside Council

A. Ohlone Film, Video, and Multimedia Festival: Bill Parks

Bill Parks from the Monitor asked for \$400 for the Annual Ohlone College Film Festival on February 7. There will be a \$10 entry fee. Discussion is moved for next week.

B. Open Forum on Smoke-Free Campus: Sang Trieu

There will be a public open forum for the non-smoking campus policy. It will be on Wednesday, January 28, from 2-3pm in room 7102. Everyone is encouraged to go and voice their concerns.

C. Parking Fund: Deanna Walston and Joanne Schultz

They passed a budget sheet to illustrate the proposed parking fees and will take this to the Board of Trustees. With the parking fees raised, there will be less net activity and fund balance. There are a total of 2,316 parking spaces available on campus including 344 in lots M, N, O, and P. They will run numbers to see the outcome of adding a \$2 daily parking fee on both upper and lower parking lots as well as increasing the permit fee to \$26 per semester.  - c. Communities protect the natural environment and promote liability.
 - d. Regional stewardship develops shared solutions.

Everyone was given preparatory questions to consider before the symposium.
