Pitcher signs a **“National Letter of Intent”** to play Division I baseball in Hawaii next season!



FREMONT, CA - Kurtis Sherer a sophomore pitcher for the Ohlone College baseball team signed a national letter of intent to play for Coach Estrella at The University of Hawaii at Hilo in 2009. “I am extremely excited and really looking forward to the opportunity Coach Estrella and the Hilo coaching staff is giving me at the Division I level” said Sherer. “ It is a great chance to go to a good school academically, as well as play against a tough D-I schedule” Sherer, who currently holds a 3.83 GPA with likely be the Renegades closer out of the bullpen this spring.

Sherer was primarily used as a middle relief pitcher last year for Ohlone College. He helped guide his team to the California State playoffs. Kurtis had 13 strikeouts in 19 innings of relief as a freshman.
