## *2 - Ohlone Baseball Players Move on to the Next Level!*

**FREMONT, CA** — This past week, outfielders Jermaine Collins, and Jarred Berrier both earned baseball scholarships to move on to the 4 year Colleges.

Collins, a 6'1, 200lb Ohlone outfielder earned a baseball scholarship to play at Western Oregon University. The hard hitting Collins hit .319 for Ohlone last season, with 8-2B's and 2-3B's. He also added 5-SB, and 11 RBI's. As a freshman, Collins had 3-HR's and 7-RBI's to help the Renegades offense. Last season Collins had a game winning RBI, 2B against Mission College on Feb 13. This was big come from behind win in the 9<sup>th</sup> inning for Ohlone.

Jermaine prepped at James Logan High School Head Coach-John Goulding. Collins helped lead Logan High School into the NCS play-offs in 2003, and 2004. Collins will be entering a Western Oregon University team that is winners of seven straight conference titles, and is ranked 41st nationally in the NCAA Division II National Baseball Coaches Association pre-season poll. The Wolves are coached by Jeremiah Robbins. Robbins earned "GNAC" and "West Region" coach of the year honors. Collins should add to the Wolves offense, and fight for innings in the outfield this spring.

The 5'10, 175lb Berrier is headed to the Heartland to attend York College in Nebraska. Jarred was a 2 year starter in centerfield for the Renegades. Berrier possesses great speed, and has the ability to track down almost everything that stays in the ball park. "In my 17 years at Ohlone, Jarred is the best defensive centerfielder I have ever coached," said former Head Coach and Athletic Director Paul Moore. "Jarred is a great teammate, and a very hard worker."

Berrier helped lead the Ohlone Renegades to a State play-off berth in 2007 against Fresno City College. He racked up a team high - 23 stolen bases in 2007 which was ranked #3 in all of the Coast Conference. Jarred also had 14 RBI, 3 2B, and a .392 OB% last season for Ohlone. Berrier will enter a York College team that is coming off their first Regional appearance in program's history, and it is definitely a program on the rise. York's Head Coach Nick Harlan is a California native of Oroville, CA. Coach Harlan is in his third year at York and had a record of 93-72. Berrier should provide the Panthers with some depth in the outfield this season, and vie for a starting role in 2009.

Both athletes earned their Associates Degrees from Ohlone College this past semester. "We are very proud of both players for their dedication to their schooling and getting a degree," said Kunis " Both Jarred, and Jermaine have represented Ohlone baseball very well over the past 2 years, and we wish them all the best at their new school's"
