

OHLONE Baseball loses to Canada

Renegades loss a 6-0 lead to fall to the Colts

REDWOOD CITY, CA- Ohlone College lost this afternoon to Canada College by the score of 14-6. Renegades starting pitcher Joe Gardner pitched 4 solid innings of scoreless baseball, only giving up 1 hit. It was in the 5th inning that Canada's bats came alive scoring 5 unanswered runs in their half of the 5th to make the score 6-5 Ohlone. Canada scored 3 more off of reliever Ian Hoff to make the score 9-5. *"I thought Gardner pitched well up to that point", said Head Coach Tom Kunis. "He had all his pitches working for him early on, and did a good job keeping them off balance." "With conditions like we had it is important that we keep the ball don in the zone. As a pitching staff we did not do that today, and it cost us."*

The Ohlone offense was led by Sophomore Justin Lunday who went 2-4, and had a big 3-run HR in the 2nd inning to put Ohlone on the board. He also had a single in the 6th inning. Shortstop Rich McDowell hit the ball well again going 3-4 on the afternoon with a double and a pair of singles. Outfielder Zach Townsend also had a big hit, a triple in the 4th inning. He was 1-4 with an RBI. Braxton Miller was 1-4 with a double and an RBI.

Canada would tack on a few more runs in the 7th and 8th inning of off the Ohlone bullpen. Sophomore Nick Colvin came into the game in the 8th, and held the Colts to only run while striking out 2 batters, and giving Ohlone a chance to answer back. *"Colvin did a good job for us today," said Kunis. "He kept his pitches down and gave us an opportunity late in that game to do something with our bats."*

Ohlone looks to get back on the winning side of thing as they travel to Monterey Peninsula College for a conference matchup this Saturday. Game time is at 12:00pm.
