

RENEGADES Rally for 18-7 Victory over Taft

Murchison earns 6th win of the year

FREMONT, CA- The Ohlone baseball (11-12) team celebrated St. Patrick's Day by opening up the 2008 "Ohlone Spring Invitational" with a big win over Taft College (9-19) of the Central Valley Conference 18-7 on Monday afternoon. Taft College came into today's game off the heels of huge win over #2 ranked Fresno City College 2-1, but was out hit today 16-7 by the Renegades in the contest.

Starter Shane Murchison (6-1) gave p four runs in the first inning, but found his rhythm and struck out 4 Taft batters over the next 5 innings only allowing three hit on the way to his 6th win of the season. Relief pitcher Ian Hoff came in to the ball game in the 5th inning and pitched 2 solid innings for Ohlone, allowing no hits, and striking out 1. After the 7th inning the Renegades used Cole Campana, Michael Annino, Scott Camacho, and Sean Henning to secure the victory. The bull-pen combined 3 strikeouts, while only giving up 4 hits in 5 innings of work.
