## LUNA & MARTIN SIGN “NATIONAL LETTERS OF INTENT”

*Both Pitchers earn baseball scholarships to play Division I for San Jose State*

November 15, 2008 – It was a very exciting day for the Ohlone College baseball program. Two players from this years team signed “National Letters of Intent” to play Division-I baseball next season! David Luna and Sean martin, both pitchers have both earned baseball scholarships to compete at San Jose State in 2010.

David Luna a 3<sup>rd</sup> year sophomore had an outstanding freshman year for Ohlone in 2008. Luna was voted a unanimous choice for 1<sup>st</sup> Team ALL-COAST CONFERENCE. He split time for the Renegades last season as a DH /RHP hitting .317 with 12 2B, 7 HR and 37 RBI. He was also 4-1 on the mound in 15 appearances with 25 strikeouts. Luna will help the 2009 Renegades out in both hitting and pitching this spring. Luna also maintains a 3.0 GPA at Ohlone College.

“I am very proud of David Luna”, said Head Baseball Coach Jordon Twohig. “David shows three pitchers for a strike and has the ability to keep hitters off balance.” “David has put a tremendous amount of time into his studies these past 2 years, and I am thrilled he will get the opportunity at the Division I level.”

Sean Martin is a freshman this year at Ohlone. It is not typical for a freshman to sign a national Letter of Intent in his first fall, but Sean is a different case. Martin had an outstanding senior year at local Newark Memorial High school for Head Coach Dan Freitas going 11-1 and helping his team to a 1<sup>st</sup> place finish in the Mission valley League.

“ Sean was a NCAA qualifier out of high school, and after speaking with him and San Jose State, we all felt that it would be the right fit for Sean to join the Spartans in 2010”, said Twohig. “ Sean is a tremendous competitor and has the making of a great college pitcher, although we’d love to keep him, I am very happy to move him onto the Division I level”.

“I feel that San Jose State is getting 2 very quality arms to help them in the years to come,” Said Coach Twohig. “ I have the upmost respect for the coaching staff at San Jose, and feel both players with be in great hands.”

Both Luna and Martin look to be in Ohlone’s pitching rotation this upcoming spring. Ohlone opens their regular 2009 spring season at Sacramento City College January 27.
