

Offense scores 4 in 9th to beat Canada

Hoff earns his 3rd win of the season

FREMONT, CA- The Ohlone Renegades extended their conference record to 3-0 on Wednesday with a 7-5 come from behind victory at Canada College in Redwood City, Ca. Ian Hoff earned his 3rd win of the season by throwing 2 scoreless innings in relief.

Through the first 7 innings the Renegades were held to 1 run by Canada pitcher Anthony Armanino. In the 8th inning, Armanino was replaced by Dan Zamudio and Ohlone took advantage. The Renegades offense was able to chip away at the 5-1 lead by scoring twice in the inning to make the score 5-3.

In the top of the 9th, Canada went to their bullpen again and brought in Bret Kilburg to close the game out. JoJo Hernandez led off the inning with a double down the left field line. Will Bourgein quickly followed with a single to left and Ohlone was in business. A few pitches later, Canada tried to pick Bourgein off first base. A rundown ensued but Bourgein was able to get back to first base safely but the throw by the Canada shortstop got away and Hernandez was able to score from third to make the score 5-4. After a walk to Tanner Laran, Cody Foster tied the game with a single to left field. Will Bourgein scored from second on the play. Jeff Johnson then wore a pitch in the back to load the bases for Braxton Miller. Miller struck out swinging but the 3rd strike got by the Canada catcher which allowed Laran to scamper across the plate for the Renegades 6th run of the contest. With runners now on 2nd and 3rd for Ohlone, Canada opted to intentionally walk Zach Johnson to set up the double play opportunity. Ryan Kanzaki then stepped to the plate a hammered a single to left field to bring in Ohlone's 7th and final run of the game.

In the bottom of the 9th, Ian Hoff shut the door on the Colts with 3 groundball outs and sealed another victory for the Renegades. David Luna started the game for Ohlone and went 5 innings, gave up 7 hits, 4 runs, walked 3, and struck out 4 Colt hitters on the day. Cory Krisman pitched the 6th and 7th innings giving up 1 unearned run, 1 walk, and struck out 1 Colt batter. Ohlone is now 3-0 in the Coast Pacific Conference and 16-3 on the season overall. The Renegades will now head back home for a 2:00pm start on Thursday against Mission College. Freshmen Sean Martin will take the ball for Ohlone and will look to earn his 5th win of the season
