



Jeff Johnson named 2009 All-American

Ian Hoff named to the ALL-Northern CA 1st –Team

FRESNO, CA - The California Community College baseball coaches had their annual all-state meeting this past weekend in Fresno. The coaches voted and recognized many deserving athletes for All-Northern and Southern California teams, and for All-American accolades. Ohlone Colleges Jeff Johnson was voted selected to the All-American Team as a designated hitter. Jeff finished the season with 19-HR (1st in CA), 66-RBI (1st in CA), and .865 slugging percentage (2nd in CA). Because of Jeff's unbelievable output this season, every single coach in Northern California voted him for this honor. It was the only unanimous vote of the morning's meetings. Jeff was also selected by the coaches as the 2009 Rawlings "Big Stick" Award winner. This award is given out to the states best hitter.



"Jeff is very deserving of these accolades", said Head Coach Jordon Twohig. "Jeff is a tireless worker and one of the best hitters I have seen in my coaching career, I am very proud of his accomplishments."

Also recognized at the All-State meetings was Ohlone pitcher Ian Hoff. Hoff was selected to the All-

Northern California 1st Team as a relief pitcher. Ian had a breakout year for Ohlone as he finished the season with the #1 ERA in the state of California at a 1.25. Hoff finished the season 9-3 with 83 innings pitched. He allowed only 12 earned runs in 23 appearances while striking out 57 batters and walking only 6 hitters the entire year!

"Ian was our team captain and leader both on and off the field", said Coach Twohig. "He will be a tough one to replace in what he brought to our ball club on a daily basis; he is very deserving of this honor."



Both players had tremendous season individually, and both helped to lead Ohlone to the Coast Conference Championship as well as a Regional Championship and a top #1 seed in the playoffs. Ohlone finished the season 37-11.
