Purpose, Activities I. Active review and report on the proper expenditure of taxpayers' money for school construction;	I.a. The Committee reviewed the Second Quarter 2004-2005 Bond Report prepared by Don Eichelberger at its February 7, 2005 meeting. He pointed out specific budget/expense estimates that had been revised, mostly due to mitigation requirements. I.b. At the April 4, 2005 Committee meeting, the Committee reviewed a scope and budget report on the Newark Center. I.c. At the June 6, 2005 meeting, Don Eichelberger presented a budget report with revised fund allocation for the Master Plan of the Fremont Campus. I.d. The Fourth Quarter Bond
	Financial Report was reviewed at the October 3, 2005 meeting. The Committee also received an update on the issuance of Series B.
	I.e. The Second Quarter Bond Report (2005-2006) was provided by Don Eichelberger at the March 6, 2006 meeting.

	1.d. The Financial Audit and Bond Performance Audit was provided by Joanne Schultz at the March 6, 2006 meeting. It was noted that the independent performance audit did not present any corrective recommendations.
	1.e. The Committee discussed the applications of new members to be approved at the Board meeting of May, 2006, at their March 6, 2006 meeting. Also discussed was the value and impact of the Committee and its purposes.

At the <u>February 7, 2005</u> meeting of the Oversight Committee, Don Eichelberger presented current information on planning for the Fremont campus. He included athletic fields, utilities and other planned projects.

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facilities; (as stated in the full text of the Measure A Bond Measure - "to oversee the implementation of the General Obligation Bond Report, perform annual audits and assure that bond moneys are only spent on projects identified in the General Obligation Bond Report.") 2. Ensuring that no funds are used for any teacher or administrative salaries or other school operating expenses. [Education Code 15278(b)	II.1.b. Don also provided an update on the Newark Center project at the February 7, 2005 meeting. Dr. Treadway announced that the ground breaking ceremony at the center was scheduled for May 24, 2005. II.1.c. Simon Barros provided plans for the new Student Support Services Center project at the February 7, 2005 meeting of the Committee. He advised that the building was planned for 25, 000 assignable square feet. Other bond projects, such as infrared cameras, stair replacement, door and railing replacements, were also reviewed at this meeting. II.1.d. At the June 6, 2005 meeting of the Committee, the members were updated on the reallocation of bond funds related to the new Newark campus and the Fremont campus. II.1.e. At the March 6, 2006 meeting, Don Eichelberger provided a Bond Status Report, updating information on the Newark site, the Student Support Services building, and upcoming award of bids.

Review efforts by the district to maximize bond revenues by implementing cost saving measures, including, but not limited to: Mechanisms designed to reduce the cost of professional fees; Mechanisms designed to reduce the cost of site preparation; Recommendations regarding the joint use of core facilities; Mechanisms designed to reduce costs by incorporating efficiencies in school site design; and	III.1.a. The Committee learned of the preliminary schedule for the site package and building package for the Newark site at its regular meeting of June 6, 2005. They were informed that awarding of bids for this project were expected to take place in the fall, with building to begin in 2006. III.1.b. At the October 3, 2005 meeting of the Oversight Committee, the committee examined budget and scope revisions. They were also informed of efforts to
