Focus Topic: Time to Check in with Students!

The semester is underway, rosters are stabilizing, and students should be feeling comfortable with navigating your online course. But are they? This is the perfect time to check in with them to make sure they are finding what they need to be successful in your course. Does your Home Page provide them with clear directions for where they will find content and assignments? Do they know how to contact you and when to expect a response from you? If you have a synchronous class, have you seen every student in your zoom classroom? Are there clear directions for when you meet and how to find the zoom classroom? Hopefully, the answer to all of the above questions is “YES, of course!”

So now, you can focus on asking students what **you** can do to help them be more successful in the class. You can discover which students prefer written feedback rather than verbal feedback, should you be inclined to provide audio feedback on assignments. You can ask if there are outside challenges that are making it difficult for them to meet deadlines or show up to a synchronous class. A few select questions in a non-graded survey at the beginning of the semester goes a long way toward intercepting navigation and other challenges students are facing and showing them that you are concerned about them and their success.

Reaching out to non-responsive Students

Do you have a few students who aren't responding to your email messages? If you would like to reach out to them one more time, eCampus can provide you with a roster that includes students' personal email addresses. Request the roster by submitting a Canvas Faculty Support [form](#).

Professional Development:

Did you know that there are funds available for Professional Development outside of Ohlone College? Each year, adjunct faculty may [submit a request](#) for up to \$250 and full-time faculty may request up to \$400 for workshops, courses, and projects that relate to an employee's role at the college and support college goals and objectives. Requests, approved by the dean, must be submitted, and approved at least one month prior to the event.
